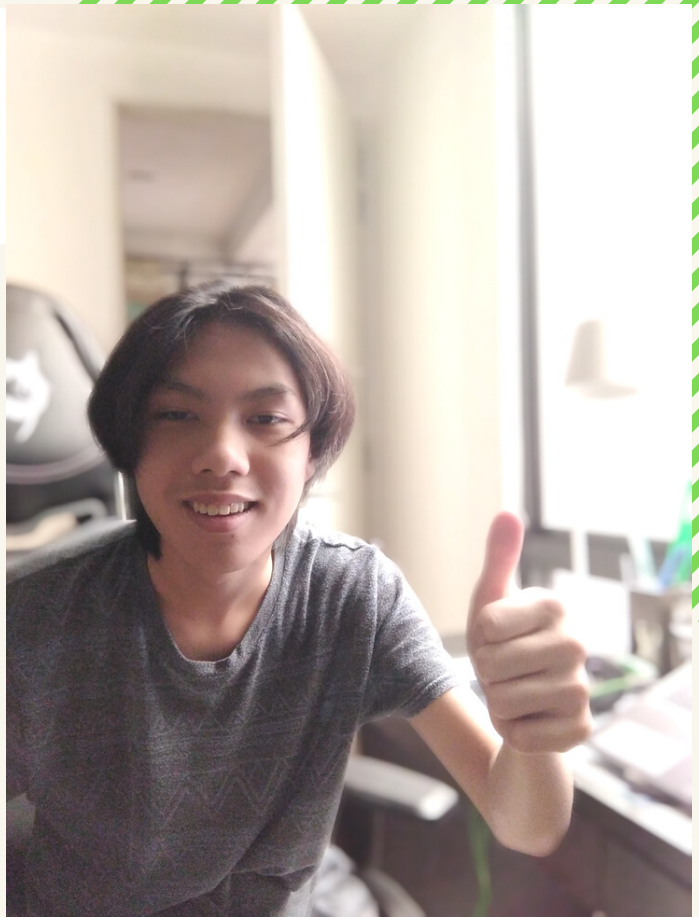

Top Achiever Award



Hi! My name is Ng See Wei and I'm a graduate of 2020. I'm currently doing A-levels at UCSI. My hobbies include reading, playing floorball, as well as watching anime and K-drama, if that counts!

What motivates you to excel in your academics?

I think if you want to excel, you will excel. Even if your parents are like "You must get straight As," I don't think that is enough to motivate you. If you want to achieve straight As, you will need to work towards that. You also need to ENJOY studying. If you enjoy studying, then you should be able to score well.

How do you *make yourself* enjoy studying?

I enjoyed studying when I started doing past papers. When I start doing them, I could sit at my desk for hours! After you get the hang of doing past papers, it kind of gets fun.



You achieved 7A*s and 3As in the Cambridge IGCSE November 2020 series. What was your main motivation?

I think the main reason is that I was aiming for a scholarship! And personally I also really wanted that 10 A*s.

Back while I was in primary school, I was never considered a smart kid. In the UPSR exams, I achieved only three As and so I wanted to change that.

And so that's why I studied really hard! I knew that if I didn't work hard now, I would be a bigger burden to my parents. In college, I want to fund my own studies as much as possible and that's why I worked so hard for a scholarship.

How was the quarantine experience for you? Could you describe your daily habits?

During the lockdown, I studied for 3 hours on days I had no classes. For the IGCSEs, I started studying intensely around September and October because that was closer to the exams. I had to put myself in that "I need to study" zone. For me, how I get into the zone was by going on YouTube and watching 14-hour-long study sessions. It's really effective sometimes because it urges you to be productive.



Let's say I'm currently a "C-student" and I want to improve to be an "A-star-student", what do you advise as my first steps?

I think the most important step is to sit down, take your textbook, then scheme through and make sure you understand all the concepts. If you don't understand something, look it up online. There are so many different resources online—YouTube, Google, etc. You will definitely find something that can help you understand. Once you've gained understanding, incorporate it into your notes, or highlight points in your book, and then memorize it and go on to do test questions.

Also, you can ask your friends!

I really like that about my class because we often help each other out.

How do you maximize your time in school?

By paying attention in class! By doing that, you can get the maximum information possible. Sometimes the teacher's voice can be really *soothing*, and the classroom environment is nice and cool. But, try to stay awake as much as possible because that's when you get the most valuable information. Sometimes you can't get that in textbooks.



Could you share with us some of your top revision tips?

My top revision tip is to do past papers! As long as you are able to finish your past papers, you will be able to score during the exams because the IGCSE exam questions are all pretty similar. If you can get the hang of the pattern of the exam questions, you'll be able to score.
